

David Campbell Biography

The Hon. David Andrew Campbell, born on 27 July 1957 in Bulli, New South Wales, is a distinguished figure in Australian politics. He joined the Labor Party in the mid-1970s and served as an alderman on the Council of the City of Wollongong from 1987 to 1999, becoming the Lord Mayor from September 1991 to 1999. His contributions to the community were recognised in 1995 when he was appointed a Fellow of the University of Wollongong.

Elected as the Member for Keira in March 1999, Campbell represented the Labor Party and secured re-election in 2003 and 2007. His political career saw him hold various ministerial positions, including Minister for Regional Development, Minister for the Illawarra, and Minister for Small Business in 2003, Minister for Water Utilities in 2006, and later, Police Minister and Minister for Illawarra following the 2007 election. In 2008, he was promoted to Minister for Transport, a role he held until his resignation in 2010. Campbell announced his retirement from politics on 28 September 2010, deciding not to seek Labor Party endorsement or re-election for the seat of Keira in the 2011 general election.
