Are we really dealing with a credible person and organisation? But I think also, the Grand Master had the same gamble. He'd done some research, um, he, he'd made a commitment, but it was a gamble for him as well.

Um, I've got no doubt that Wollongong was a winner, and what I've observed, what I've been told is that Fo Guang Shan and the Nan Tien Temple were winners as well, so that's, that's pretty exciting.

So, that reflection, I think, is important in what we're doing here, making this, this oral history. Um, the other thing for me personally, and I think for other people, is to understand the different aspects to the temple, so the different prayer halls and what they represent.
