

Venerable Yi Lai Biography

Venerable Yi Lai was born in 1946 in Yilan, Taiwan. She began studying Buddhism at an early age and later served at the Da Ci Children's Home, transforming it into a sanctuary for kids. Her ten years of dedication there led to her ordination and a life committed to Dharma propagation.

In 1991, Venerable Yi Lai became the first disciple from Fo Guang Shan to bring Humanistic Buddhism to Africa, establishing the Newcastle Zen and Pure Land Centre. She later moved to Australia, where she integrated Buddhist education and culture with local society at Chung Tian Temple. Her work earned her numerous accolades, including the "Centenary Medal" from Queen Elizabeth II.

Appointed Head Abbess of Fo Guang Shan in Australia and New Zealand in 2006, she was instrumental in establishing Nan Tien Institute. Returning to Taiwan in 2011, she continued her charitable work as Director of the Fo Guang Shan Charity Council.

Venerable Yi Lai has remained unwavering in her commitment to spreading Humanistic Buddhism, making significant contributions both in Taiwan and internationally.
